3 What is Dr. King saying about the connection between injustice and justice? Why does injustice in one place affect everyone?

4 Think of an example of injustice in your school or community. How could you help address it?

5 What message is Dr. King communicating about taking action? Why is timing important in this quote?

6 Describe a time when you stood up for what was right, even though it was difficult. What did you learn from that experience?
